






Military Education Life Cycle

TA Policy (AFI 36-2670)

- Tuition Assistance funds are provided by the Air Force to pursue <u>approved degree</u> programs (Associate, Bachelor and Master degrees) <u>not yet accomplished</u>. (Non-disclosure of degree level and use of TA for degree levels already accomplished will result in <u>UCMJ</u> action)
- The window for MILTA requests will be limited to no earlier than 45 days and no later than 7 days prior to term start date.
 - \$4,500 max per fiscal year (Oct-Sep), \$250 per SH or \$166.66 per QH
 - Pays tuition for classes only
 - Does not cover class/institution fees (registration, lab, parking, etc.) Example Institutions:XXX
- Maximum credit caps:
 - 42 SH for graduate degree
 - 124 SH for undergraduate degree

Authorized **two (2)** program changes at undergraduate level (interest inventory and general counseling recommended and required prior to initiating change)

No changes authorized after 90 SH or 135 QH completed

- CCAF /S regionally accredited
- Must be 5-skill level prior to separation to receive awarded degree
- Military Technology & Applied Sciences Management (applicable to all USSF Enlisted)



Associate to Bachelor Cooperative (AU-ABC)

- Bachelor of Arts/Science
 - Directly related to Member's SFSC
 - Partnering Universities and Colleges
 - □ Cat I CCAF grads guaranteed no more than 60 SH to complete their BS/BA degree.
 - □ Cat II University/College **may** add pre-req coursework (no more than 3 classes (9 SH) to fulfill BS/BA degree.
 - □ Cat III Graduates will need to complete no more than 60 SH beyond their CCAF degree. These degrees must still link to one or more CCAF AAS programs and have exceptional value for the Space Force.

Enlisted USSF COOL (Credentialing)

What it does:

- Payment of prep courses and certification fees up to \$4,500 (per career)
 - □ Does not pay for courses or prep materials other than books with a \$500 max per goal
 - Credentialing tests relating directly to your SFSC
 - □ One credential related to already obtained academic degree (AAS degree or higher)
 - □ One credential unrelated to your SFSC with supervisor approval
- "Leadership cert" requirement has been adjusted to reflect accomplishments and skill, rather than rank*
- A cert can be pursued within 180 days of DOS & now does not require self-funding!
- From a different "Pot of Money" than MilTA.
- Active Duty enlisted Guardians



SkillBridge

- SKB provides eligible Guardians (officer and enlisted) opportunities to develop their career skills or learn new skills through civilian:
- 1. On-the-job training
- 2. Apprentice
- 3. Internships
- Must be within <u>180</u> days of approved retirement or separation to participate
- Recommend you start as early as possible* to allow processing time
- Guardians must:
 - Step 1: Attend TAP
 - Step 2: Attend the mandatory briefing at the Education Office
 - Step 3: Submit their SkillBridge application in AFVEC to the Education Center at least 30 days prior to the

SkillBridge start date





GI Bill

Chapter 30 – Montgomery GI Bill (MGIB)

- ❖ Eligibility: \$1,200 = Maximum benefit
- ❖ VA: up to \$2,358/month paid to you you pay school
 - You must pay for tuition/fees
 - You must pay for books/supplies
- Many vocational training courses are approved
- Multiple licensure or certification exams are paid for
- ❖ Veterans have up to 10 years after sep/ret to use it

**Amount of tuition always correlates to student course load



Chapter 33 - POST 9/11 GI Bill

- Eligibility: Time Served*
- Can be transferred to family = 4-YEAR ADSC
- ❖ VA pays Tuition and Fees to the School directly:
 - Public Univ: In-State tuition & fees paid "Choice Act"
 - Private Univ: \$27K per year; or use Yellow Ribbon*
- VA pays Stipends to the Student directly:
 - ➤ Housing = E-5 w/dep rate of school zip code
 - ➤ Book Stipend = up to \$1,000 year
- Many vocational training courses approved
- ❖ Multiple licensure/certification exams paid for From January 2013 – Lifetime benefit

GI Bill – Top Up

TA Top Up is a way to use your GI Bill to pay the difference in TA if your school is expensive. You can click the TA Top Up box on your funding request if you are interested in using this – however, please note:

- ❖ When you check the box, you will lock yourself into your current GI Bill selection
- ❖ Most Guardians have MGIB, and have paid the \$100 for 12 months that is required for this benefit. This is a good benefit, but if you want Post-9/11 benefits (the only one you can transfer to dependents), you'll have to apply for them on the VA website https://www.va.gov/education/
- ❖ Apply on the VA website and get your COE (certificate of eligibility)
- Using TA Top Up will tap into your 36 months of GI Bill benefits (by a pro-rated amount)

Course cost is \$1000 (3SH)





Applying for GI Bill (MGIB or POST 9/11)

- When the student is ready to use either one of the GI Bill Benefits for school:
 - Go to benefits.va.gov
 - Fill out VA 22-1990 "Education Benefits"
 - Will need bank account information
- Member receives "Certificate of Eligibility"
 - Important "proof" document; make copies of it!
 - Provide to School Certifying Official to either validate schedule (MGIB) or to initiate payment from VA instead of from you (Post 9/11)!
